POLICY GOALS

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES School

 Staff will collaborate and determine the allocation of awards using professional knowledge, data analysis and discretion.

DISTRIBUTION OF AWARDS

Teachers will select a minimum of two (2) students and maximum of four (4) students from each class to receive awards for the categories below. As educators, academic growth and good scholarship are valued and will be rewarded. Additional awards will be offered if deemed appropriate dependent on class size and individual performance.

- 1. Junior Primary (Year 1)
- 2. Middle Primary (Year 2/3)
- 3. Senior Primary (Year 4/5/6)

AWARD CATERGORIES 2019

- 1. Junior Primary (Year 1 and Year 2)
- 2. Middle Primary (Year 3 and Year 4)
- 3. Senior Primary (Year 5 and Year 6)

Academic Award Criteria

- Good Scholarship
- Consistent application across all learning areas
- Measurable academic growth

Endeavour Award Criteria

- Consistently working to the best of their ability
- · Communicating positively and constructively with others
- · Displaying an enthusiastic attitude towards learning

Kindergarten and Pre-Primary awards

All Kindergarten students will receive a certificate of attainment and a book.

All Pre-Primary students will receive a certificate of attainment.

Citizenship award

To be eligible the student must receive 'consistently' in Attitude, Behaviour and Effort criteria on their school report.

Sportsmanship Award

This will be awarded to one (1) student across all year groups.

Sportsmanship Award Criteria

To be eligible the athlete must exemplify the ideals of sportsmanship with fair play, team-work, ethical behaviour and integrity.

Woodside Science Award

This award is supplied by Woodside and is awarded to:

- (1) Pre-Primary Year 2
- (1) Year 3 Year 6
