Congratulations to the Year 6 school councillors for running a fantastic school assembly last week. All of the students spoke clearly and confidently taking their roles very seriously. This was a great message for all the students to see we can all help and support each other and each of us has strength.

The parent meetings will start this week and through these meetings parents can get a clear understanding of how their child has started the year. Individual learning programs have been set up for students needing further assistance and extension programs for others. Open communication between parents and the classroom teacher is so important to ensure the connection between home and school is strong.

At the previous Tammin Primary School P&C meeting, I discussed one of our school priorities for 2019 which is STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics). The P&C were very supportive of our program and have offered significant financial support to the school. It is fantastic to see the P&C working alongside the school to ensure the students receive the best opportunities and experiences. We have a STEM incursion organised for term two where the students will work on project based learning around technology, creating solutions, designing mapping digital systems and coding robots. In term four the year five and six students will also be competing in the *FIRST LEGO* League. *FIRST* LEGO League challenges kids to think like scientists and engineers through team work and designing a robotic program where the robot will complete tasks in a Lego designed course.

I would like to say thank you to Sam Pimlott and the Tammin Shire for funding and organising the silent disco we will be having on the last day of this term. Our focus in 'The Arts' this semester is dance and the students will have an opportunity to learn some hip hop moves and participate in interactive dance challenges.

Term one has been a fun filled term of sport, dance and motivating learning opportunities in class.







We have 24 HP Notebook computers. We use these computers in our classroom. This term we have been using the laptops for writing narratives.

Your child needs to be turning 5 in 2019 for the registration to go through, this minimum age is set by Auskicks National program.

Cost is \$70 and again is set at a National level – this will include an Auskick pack posted directly to your child.

<u>Information</u>; The junior games will again be played on Friday nights in 2019. Players are expected to arrive by 5:00 pm for warm up and the games will commence at 5:30 pm.

Training for juniors only will be on Wednesday evenings from $5:00~\rm{pm}$ – the start date will be confirmed as soon as all coaching positions are filled.

Parents/carers will be required to help out with some duties during the season- goal umpiring and/or jumper washing (the committee and umpires can show you how it's done if your unsure – it's very easy).

Junior players will be given the opportunity to play before KATS league games when they are playing Beverley, Quairading and Cunderdin as these town have juniors that are keen to play.

Auskick will be held on Friday evenings from $5:30~\mathrm{pm}$ for up to an hour – parent support is much appreciated in running these sessions.

As a parent, you want to do the best for your child, but how do you know what's right? What do you do when your child answers back? Or is being bullied at school? Or starts telling obvious lies?

Over coming weeks, I will share some of Triple P's proven tips for the best ways to handle common behavioural and developmental problems in children. From battling disobedience to encouraging homework routines, I'll cover those everyday issues to help you work out some strategies to suit your family.

I'll highlight common "parent traps" and hopefully make the very important job of raising kids as enjoyable and rewarding as possible.

But remember, parenting is sometimes hard work and it may take time to tackle more difficult problems. The good news is that help is always at hand. Throughout Cunderdin, Meckering and Tammin Avon & Central Wheatbelt Primary Health Child and Community Nurses are offering parenting support with Triple P, one of the world's most highly-regarding parenting programs.
