From the Principal

Work packages will be delivered to homes on a Friday afternoon.

Staffing Allocation

Mrs Sarah Haythornethwaite will be taking maternity leave for the rest of the year. In order to maintain continuity of staff for students it has been decided to employ Mrs Rosalie Packham for Term 2. Mrs Carolyn Dixon will undertake a support role and will work in the K-2 classroom on Monday's until Mrs Ebony Syred returns to school. Mrs Lee Constantine will take the role of Education Assistant in the junior room on Friday to replace Mrs Natalie MacKin who is on maternity leave.

Mrs Karen Dyer has been appointed full time so that she is available throughout the day to maintain a

strict cleaning regime—cleaning of all hard surfaces after use as well as regularly cleaning classrooms. This allocation is provided by the Department for the term to ensure that both staff and students are safe in the current COVID-19 situation.

Student drop off and collection

Parents are asked to drop students off on either Ridley or Booth Street. Parents of children in K-2 may bring them to the main office door where they will be taken to the classroom by a staff member. Students who are late should go immediately to the office to be signed in. Should there be a need to collect students early, parents are requested to go directly to the office (not beyond the black line on the ground). Hand sanitiser is available on the front desk for all visitors to use.
