K-2 Bulletin News

K-2 with Miss Sara. Miss Sara is completing her final teaching practicum in our classroom this term.

In K-2 for Talk4Writing we have been exploring the story 'The Gingerbread Man'. We have read the story aloud using actions and voice intonation, created story maps to support comprehension and made our own paper Gingerbread men. The Year 1/2's are using their Gingerbread men to orally retell their stories using the iPad app 'Chatterpix'. This approach encourages the use of literacy language needed before reading and recreating in their own writing.

Sonny said "My favourite part has been using the paint pens to make our own Gingerbread man".
