Year 6 Technology with Mr Rose.....

In week three of Term 3, our year sixes started designing their Devious Demolition Derby Destruction Devils and prepared to go head to head, toe to toe in Tammin's Sphero Demolition Derby.

If you are wondering what a Sphero is, then you're not alone. Many people think that they are just a normal robot, but they are not. A Sphero is a ball that has a robot engine that uses a magnetic force to make it move.—*Mitch*



The robot is created out of simple household materials including tissue boxes, milk lids, bottles, skewers and plastic cups. My design was simply a plastic cup taped to a tissue box with skewers connecting milk lids as wheels. I had a cut off plastic water bottle on top of the box as a pod to make it look like a mini car and spikes coming out of the side to obliterate other robots. Basically, everyone's robots battle each other in different rounds until there is a winner. -Noah



The Sphero robots were controlled by an IPad and we had been testing for four weeks. I made a bot that was made from skewers, cups and bottle lids. Mitch and I had a close match which ended in a massive slam when I made his Sphero come out of his car.
