Around the campfire, Elders and students talk about Ballardong Aboriginal Astronomy, see Aboriginal night sky constellations, and choose an appropriate story for artwork to go on a Planisphere as a saleable souvenir.

Participants also look through telescopes, enjoy a laser tour of the night sky and students will learn all about space with our astronomer.
