

## Year 3-6 Assembly



#### A note from the School Health Nurse

Online Safety - how to keep your child safe online (Information from Aimee, your School Nurse) Protecting your children from harm is just as important online as it is in the real world. As a parent or carer, you can play an important role in helping children have safe and positive experiences online.

The internet offers an exciting world of experiences for children and the whole family. It can be entertaining, educational and rewarding. However, using the internet also involves risks and challenges.

Children might be exposed to content that is sexually explicit, violent, prohibited or even illegal. They may also experience cyber bullying or be at risk from contact by strangers

Children may - unknowingly or deliberately - share personal information without realising they may be subject to identity theft, or that they are leaving behind content that might not reflect well on them in the future.

By taking an active role in talking with your kids about the risks and answering their questions or concerns about something that they find on the Internet you can help them stay safer online. For more information on keeping your children safe online try the following website:

#### SCHOOL PHOTO DAY IS COMING!

Dear Parents,

Your school photo day is coming! Approximately two weeks prior to the photo day every student will receive a personalised order envelope to bring home from Kapture Photography. The recommended method of ordering your photos is online through Kapture's website as your payment is secure and can be easily verified at any time. If you pay online, there is no need to return the order envelope to school.

#### KEEP YOUR ORDER ENVELOPE SECURE!

The unique codes contained on the envelope will be issued only once.

Alternatively, you can pay by cash and return the provided envelope to the school on the photography day. Please note the photographers cannot provide change.

#### Order EARLY for sibling photography

Sibling photos can ONLY be ordered online. Once you receive your envelope, it is imperative that you order your sibling photo early to avoid missing out! There is a physical limit in the school schedule to how many sibling photos can be taken. Once the maximum capacity of sibling orders has been reached, no more sibling orders can be placed.

If maximum capacity is not reached, sibling orders **close 12pm midday sharp**, **one business day prior** to the first photo day.

The school or the photographers <u>cannot</u> accept late orders for sibling photography. Please do not ask as your request simply cannot be accommodated.

#### Order EARLY for discount photo day prices

Order your photos within 10 calendar days of photo day to receive discount photo day prices. Late orders are handled separately to the school delivery and incur a \$30 custom service charge.

#### Other information

Late cash payment envelopes cannot be accepted by the school office or by Kapture.

Your school will notify you in a few weeks when **team and special group photos** are available to view and purchase on the Kapture website. Please note; class, individual and sibling portraits are not available to view online prior to purchase.

Kapture offer a money back guarantee for any parent who is not fully satisfied with their photo package. Should you have any queries before or after photo day, please check the FAQ's on the Kapture website.

All students will be photographed individually on photo day for school administration records AS WELL as included in their class group presentation available for purchase to all families. Should there be any reason why your child should **NOT** be included in the photo shoot –please contact the school office.

### Teen Triple P Seminars

The Triple P – Positive Parenting Program® knows all parents have different needs. That's why Triple P has many different ways for you to get your parenting help. So you can choose what will suit you and your family best.

#### Who is this for?

· parents of teenagers

#### Teen Triple P can help

- build a better relationship with your teenager
- · reduce conflict
- keep your teenager safe
- be realistic about parenting
- · take care of yourself

#### Is this you?

Your baby's almost an adult, or at least that's what he or she thinks. So life at home can be a little strained. Maybe your 13-year-old son grunts instead of speaking to you. Or your 14-year-old daughter wants to go to parties with people you don't even know. It's not that you've got a "wild" kid. You'd just like to make sure things don't get out of hand.

#### What are Teen Triple P Seminars?

Teen Triple P Seminars are for large groups of parents – perhaps 20 or more. They're informal presentations, a little like a public forum.

There are three seminars in the Teen Triple P Seminar series. You can choose to do one, two or all three of them. They deal with the most common parenting issues we all face, such as how to encourage responsible behavior, improve family relationships, deal with independence or manage problems at school or with friends.

The three seminars are:

- · Raising Responsible Teenagers
- · Raising Competent Teenagers
- · Getting Teenagers Connected

#### Where do I go for a seminar?

Seminars will usually be organised by a community organization like a local school, child health center or a church group and be held in a public space like a clubhouse or hall.

#### What Happens at a Teen Triple P Seminar?

Each seminar lasts 90 minutes. There's no homework and no follow up. But you'll be given a tip sheet to take home to remind you of the great ideas you've heard. You'll be able to start positive parenting straight away, to get back on track with your teenager – or be ready for what's ahead.
